Seminary Students

Over half of the PC(USA) financial aid budget supports students planning for a career in ministry who are attending seminary.

Presbyterian Study Grant provides aid to students attending Presbyterian related seminaries.

Continuing Education Grant provides aid to the pastors of small Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) congregations who are seeking a Doctor of Ministry.

Theological Student Loan programs assist candidates for ministry.

Endowments

We support congregations and education at Presbyterian related schools in a variety of specialized programs supported by endowments.

The Elias Boudinot Library Fund provides small churches with up to \$200 to purchase books for the pastor.

The Mariners Family Ministry Grant is available to churches and church organizations to design programs or curriculum to foster family ministry within the congregation.

Teaching of the Bible Grant provides up to \$10,000 to Presbyterian related colleges, universities, and secondary schools to develop new avenues for study of the Bible and religion at our schools.
