SCHOLARSHIP AND AUDITION INFORMATION

The Muskingum University Music Department offers performance scholarships for *music majors, music minors*, and *music participants* in voice, brass, woodwinds, percussion, keyboard, and string instruments. (Guitar and harp are not offered at this time.) Scholarship amounts are based upon a student's intended level of participation and performance ability. All scholarships are renewable, provided that students meet departmental GPA and participation requirements.

AUDITION REQUIREMENTS: MUSIC MAJORS AND MUSIC MINORS

To become a *music major* or a *music minor* requires a student to meet the general requirements for admission to the university, and to pass an audition on the primary applied instrument. Students may not declare a major or minor in music without successful completion of an audition.

The audition for the major/minor in music also serves as the scholarship audition. The audition process includes a brief interview as well as the audition itself, in which applicants are expected to demonstrate technical competency and expressive musicianship. Applicants should prepare the following:

Vocalists:

- 2 pieces in contrasting styles, 1 of which (preferably) is in a language other than English
- Sight-reading and tonal memory

Instrumentalists:

- 2 pieces in contrasting styles, or 1 longer work with contrasting sections
- 2 octaves of selected major scales (all applicants) and arpeggios (pianists only)

If the repertoire requires piano accompaniment, applicants are welcome to bring their own pianist. A pianist will be provided by the Music Department providing that a pianist has been requested, and the music has been sent at least 1 week before the audition date.

AUDITION REQUIREMENTS: MUSIC PARTICIPANTS

Music participants are students with other academic majors who would still like to take private applied lessons <u>and</u> participate in a major ensemble (Concert Choir, Wind Ensemble, or Southeastern Ohio Symphony Orchestra). While participant scholarships are smaller than major/minor scholarships, they are at least enough to cover applied lesson fees.

Applicants for participant scholarships are <u>not</u> required to prepare repertoire in advance of their audition, although they are welcome to do so if they wish, and an audition is still required. The audition consists of a brief interview and an assessment of the applicant's basic skill level on the primary instrument or voice.

Note: Students are always welcome to audition for and participate in ensembles without auditioning for a participant scholarship. Participant scholarships are intended for those students who wish to further their musical study through <u>both</u> ensemble participation and private lessons.

APPLICATION PROCESS AND AUDITION PROCEDURE: ALL APPLICANTS

Students who wish to be considered for any music performance scholarship should do the following:
