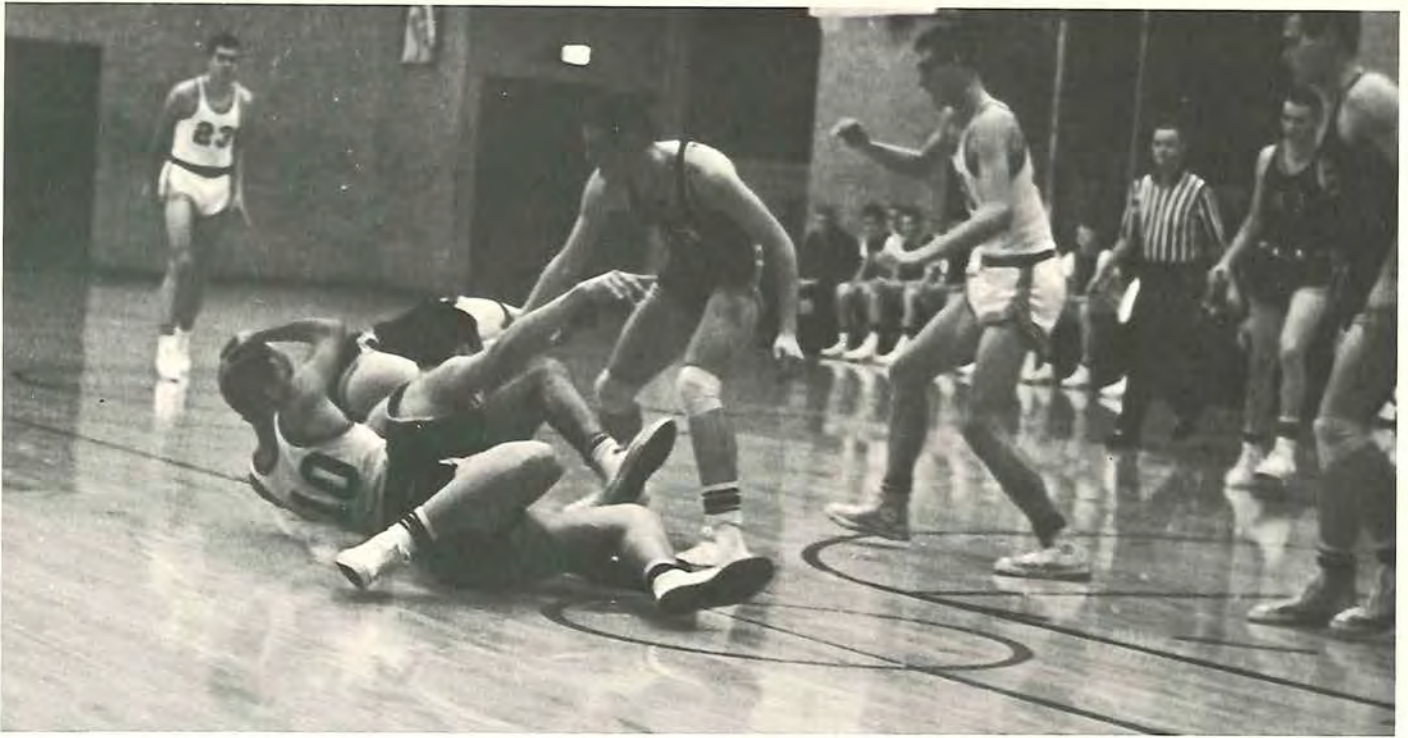


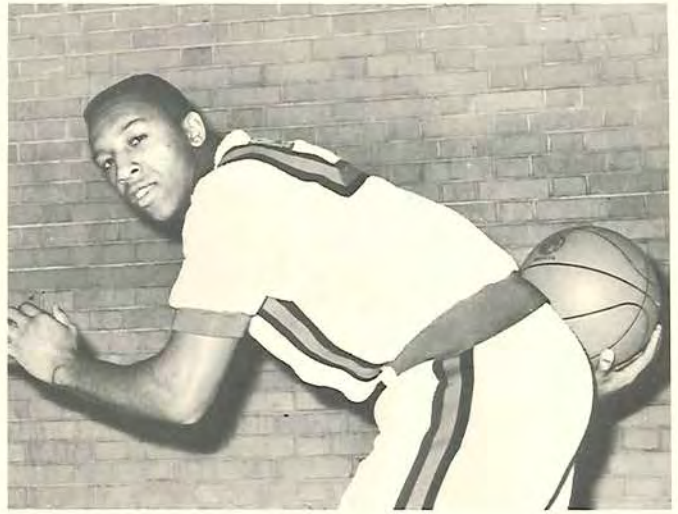
The Muskingum basketball team finished a mediocre season as far as wins and losses are concerned, but the Muskies did play some excellent basketball games and provided their fans with many memorable moments. Officially the Muskies finished fourth in the Ohio Conference with a 9-5 record. Included in this record is a noble 44-43 victory over Wittenberg in their gym. This was the first home game lost for Wittenberg in many years, and a notable tribute to the desire and competitiveness of this year's squad and coach Bob Burkholder. The conference champ Akron had to come from behind to defeat a persistent Muskingum squad by a slim four points 74-70. Outside of the conference the Muskies had some strong teams on their schedule. Youngstown University, a nationally ranked team, handed the Muskies a 36-35 loss after a thrilling struggle. Steubenville, also nationally ranked, barely beat the Muskies 66-62. In other games the squad was spotty and looked weak, but at other times they played very sound basketball.



The Muskies finished the season with a disappointing loss to Otterbein in the Ohio Conference Tournament, and thus closed out with an overall 11-12 record. The squad members appropriately voted Joe Arganbright and Fred Vollrath, both 6-4 seniors, as most valuable players. Arganbright, an outstanding player for four years led the team in scoring with an average of 16.2 points. Vollrath led the team in rebounds, averaging 12.0 a game, and showed remarkable and constant improvement during the season. Dale Featheringham, a fine Junior forward was the team's workhorse with the second highest number of rebounds and the third best shooting average. John Solomon and John Ruyan helped the team from their guard positions, and both being Juniors, will return to help next year. Solomon is acknowledged as a fine defensive player. A third guard Merle Whitis saw a great deal of action in his four-year career at Muskingum, and proved to be a real floor general. The Muskies relied on two of the more outstanding freshmen players Bob Allen and Eric Gribble. Allen led the regular players with a 47% average from the free throw line.

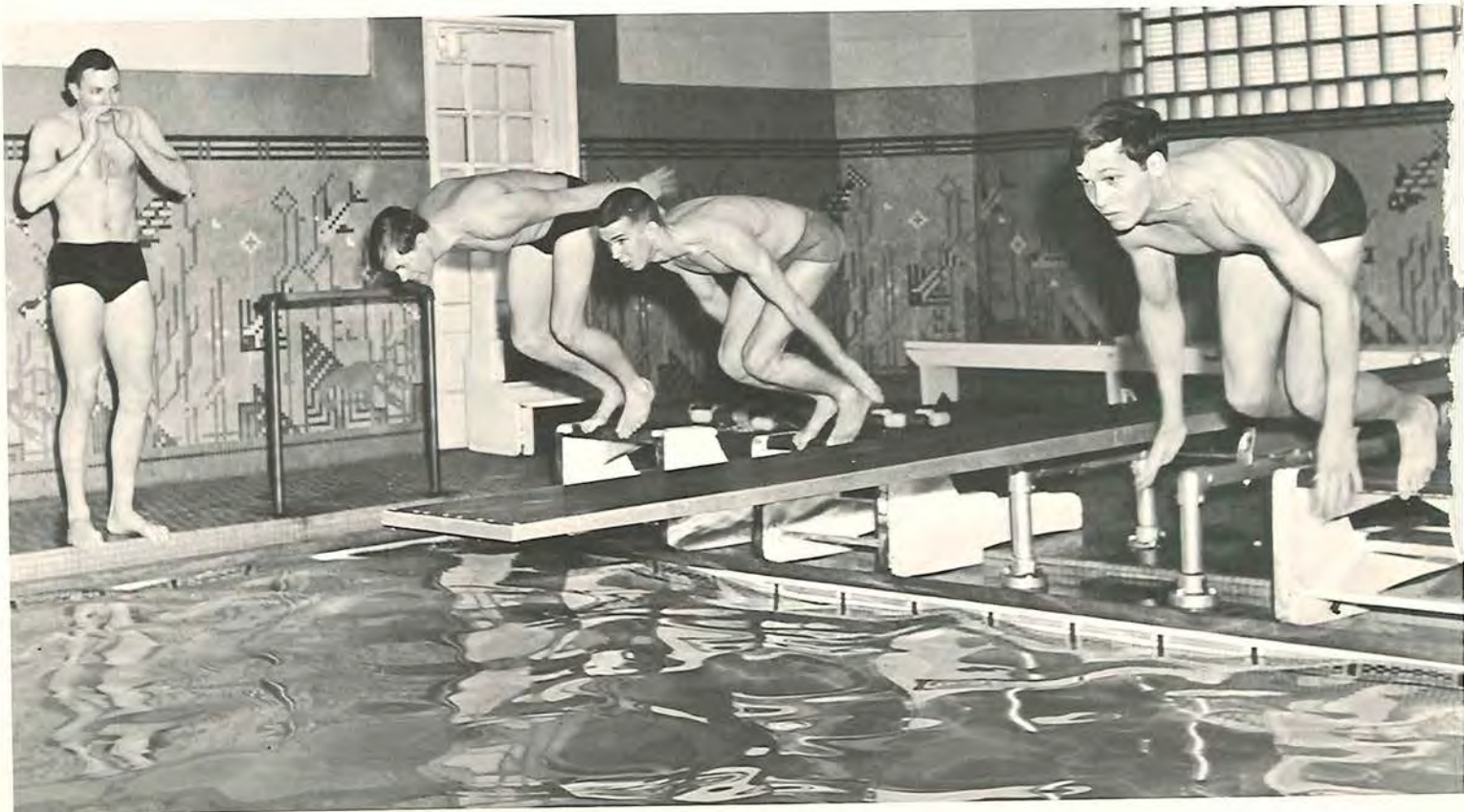

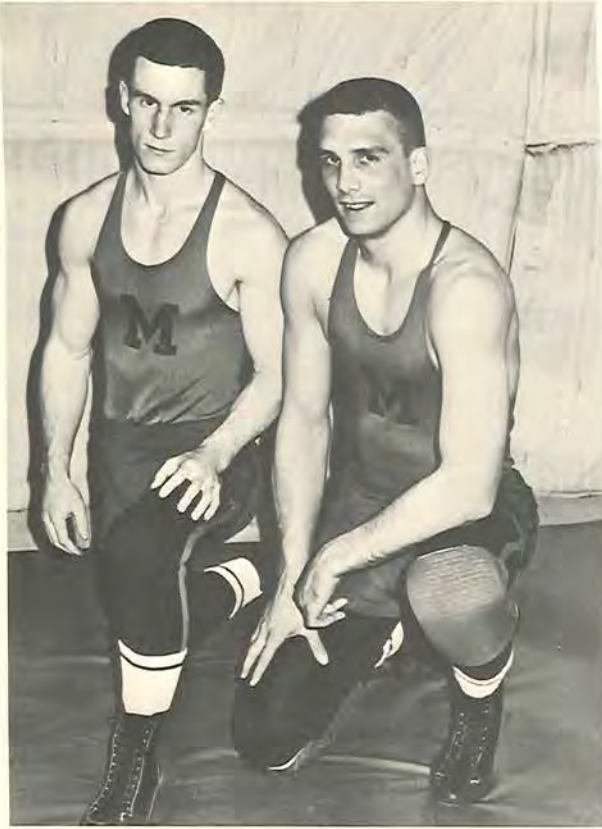

Suffering from a lack of depth this year, Coach Ken Potter's tanksters accumulated a season record of 2 wins against 8 losses. Tom Herr and "Bud" Jupin made strong contributions in the freshmen ranks as did juniors Dave Wessely and Bob Turnbull. Continued improvement was seen in the lowering of three school records. Turnbull lowered the existing 100 yard and 200 yard breast-stroke records and the 400 yard medley relay team of Gordon Davison, Turnbull, Dave Kerr, and Herr lowered the old record by 5 seconds. At the annual team elections, Jim McIlvaine and Bob Turnbull replaced graduating captains, Kerr and Linderman. The Bill Foraker Award went to the outstanding freshman, Tom Herr, and the most valuable team member chosen was Dave Kerr. The most improved swimmer from last year was diver Jim McIlvaine who compiled an outstanding dual meet record of 8 first places.



WRESTLING

The Muskie wrestling team finished the season with six wins and six losses. The team showed real improvement, and came on strong towards the end of the year, by winning six of the last seven matches, and losing a close contest to always tough Hiram. In the conference championships, co-captain Dave Wray, a junior, took Muskingum's only first place, in the 167 pound division. Dave was undefeated in 12 matches this season. Heavyweight Carl Lambert also came close to a conference championship. Carl had the second best record on the squad with four wins, one loss, and two ties in season competition. Dave Hicks finished the season with a five and one record in the 130 pound division. Dick Shelly placed second in the tournament with a three-one record in the 157 pound class. John Diven had a good chance for a first in the conference, but an injured back kept him out of competition.
