# MUSIC AND ART DEPARTMENT



The Muskingum basketball team finished a mediocre season as far as wins and losses are concerned, but the Muskies did play some excellent basketball games and provided their fans with many memorable moments. Officially the Muskies finished fourth in the Ohio Conference with a 9-5 record. Included in this record is a noble 44-43 victory over Wittenberg in their gym. This was the first home game lost for Wittenberg in many years, and a notable tribute to the desire and competiveness of this year's squad and coach Bob Burkholder. The conference champ Akron had to come from behind to defeat a persistent Muskingum squad by a slim four points 74-70. Outside of the conference the Muskies had some strong teams on their schedule. Youngstown University, a nationally ranked team, handed the Muskies a 36-35 loss after a thrilling struggle. Steubenville, also nationally ranked, barely beat the Muskies 66-62. In other games the squad was spotty and looked weak, but at other times they played very sound basketball.









The Muskies finished the season with a disappointing loss to Otterbein in the Ohio Conference Tournament, and thus closed out with an overall 11-12 record. The squad members appropriately voted Joe Arganbright and Fred Vollrath, both 6-4 seniors, as most valuable players. Arganbright, an outstanding player for four years led the team in scoring with an average of 16.2 points. Vollrath led the team in rebounds, averaging 12.0 a game, and showed remarkable and constant improve-ment during the season. Dale Featheringham, a fine Junior forward was the team's workhorse with the second highest number of rebounds and the third best shooting average. John Solomon and John Ruyan helped the team from their guard positions, and both being Juniors, will return to help next year. Solomon is acknowledged as a fine defensive player. A third guard Merle Whitis saw a great deal of action in his four-year career at Muskingum, and proved to be a real floor general. The Muskies relied on two of the more outstanding freshmen players Bob Allen and Eric Gribble. Allen led the regular players with a 47% average from the free throw line.


























#### WRESTLING




# BLACK AND MAGENTA


